



Lessening the burden of NCDs through partner organizations

The Foundation launched its oncology grants strategy in April 2016, providing support to organizations in the U.S., sub-Saharan Africa and Latin America. The goal of this approach is to improve access to oncology services and equity in delivery of care for underserved patients by building capacity and piloting innovative models with a focus on women's cancers.
